LESSONS FROM SARAH

Genesis 17:15-16 and Hebrews 11:10-11

Sermon Outline:

1. From the time Sarah became Abraham's wife, she desires to have children above all else (Gen. 11:29).

 Sarah concludes God is keeping her from having children (Gen. 16:2).
Sarah schemes an immoral and unrighteous plot for her husband to father a child by her maidservant (Genesis 16:2).

4. The result is a grave mistake and Hagar becomes contentious with Sarah, resulting in Sarah blaming Abraham and Hagar running away (Gen. 16:5-6). 5. The angel of the LORD appears to Hagar and shows her grace and tells her to return to Sarah (Gen. 16:9-10).

6. Sarah and Abraham suffer greatly over many years for their mistake of not waiting upon the LORD.

7. God renews His covenant with Abraham (Gen. 17:4-6) and includes Sarah (Gen. 17:15-16).

8. Although Sarah vacillates in her behavior through the years, she preservers and is remembered for her steadfastness of faith (Heb. 11:10-11).

Lessons from Sarah:

1. When you walk by sight and not by faith, you get impatient as Sarah did.

Do not try to rid yourself of your mistakes by disowning them as Sarah did.
Make every effort to have and show a gentle and quiet spirit as Sarah did overall.

4. Just as God knew Sarah and Abraham better than they knew themselves, He knows you better than you know yourself.

5. Have faith and trust God in everything. He will work His plan in His perfect timing.

Study Questions for Thursday's Bible Study:

1. Examine the decision-making process behind Sarah's suggestion to Abraham to have a child with Hagar. What motivations and cultural factors might have influenced her?

2. Were you surprised by Sarah's imperfections? Why do you think God never glosses over people's missteps in the Bible?

3. How does the changing of Abram's and Sarai's names impact their identities and destinies?

4. How did Abraham and Sarah respond to God's faithfulness to His promises concerning Isaac? Which of God's promises do we find hard to believe?

5. How does this message influence your understanding of God's plans transcending human understanding and timelines?

6. In what areas of your life is God currently requiring faith, patience, and perseverance? Brad Perry
