The Lessons of Martha and Mary

Luke 10:38-42 and John 12:1-8

- 1. As important as doing is, listening is the basis for all our ministry.
- 2. Although it is important to serve the Lord and others, it is more important to spend time worshipping the Lord.
- 3. Scripture gives three significant accounts of Jesus's interaction with Martha's family—Luke 10:38-42, John 11 (the death and resurrection of Lazarus), and John 12:1-8 (also occurring in Matthew 26:6-13 and Mark 14:3-9).
- 4. Humility is a constant theme in Jesus's teachings but a difficult lesson for His disciples.
- 5. Human pride can corrupt our best intentions and actions, and this occurs when we take our focus off God. Don't become self-centered, and don't measure yourself by others.
- 6. Seek to be like Mary, be still and listen to God.
- 7. Never elevate good works over sound biblical doctrine and true worship.
- 8. In Scripture, the focus is always on what God has done for us, not what we have done for Him.

Study Questions for Thursday's Bible Study:

- 1. What do Martha and Mary do right and wrong in the sermon's reference Scriptures?
- 2. What does Romans 12:10 say about love and honor?; 1 Peter 5:5 about humility?; Philippians 2:3-4 about serving others?; and 2 Corinthians 10:12 about measuring oneself?
- 3. Why is humility so difficult to have consistently?
- 4. Can you think of and share an example of your belief being more important than your actions?
- 5. Can you think of and share an example of good works flowing from true faith?
- 6. How can you cultivate a good habit pattern of spending quality time with God? Is this necessary for hearing His plans for you?
