The Lessons of Esther Esther (Chapters 1-10)

The book of Esther portrays God's providential care of people committed to Him in the midst of overwhelming challenges. Similar in this respect to the book of Ruth, Esther is, in many senses, a contrast to Ruth. In the book of Ruth, Ruth, a Moabite woman, marries a Judean man, Boaz, and remains in Judea. In Esther, a Judean woman, Esther, marries a Persian king, Ahasuerus, and remains in Persia. Esther, with the help of her relative, Mordecai, saves the Jews from Haman's wicked plot to annihilate them, establishing the Jewish feast of Purim.

The book of Esther is famous because it does not mention God directly. However, one cannot understand the story of Esther apart from God's remarkable presence and providence with His people.

- 1. God provides for us. Trust Him to provide for you, even when you don't see a solution yourself. Remember that He knows you better than you know yourself and knows what is best for vou.
- 2. God works in the details. (Philippians 4:16) Do your duty to glorify God in everything you do, and let God take care of the consequences and outcomes.
- 3. We are to trust God. (Psalm 37:5, Hebrews 2:13) "Never be afraid to trust an unknown future to a known God," states Corrie ten Boom. Put your trust in Him and keep your trust in Him.
- 4. God promises to be with us. (Romans 8:28) When we stay focused on Him, God arranges ordinary events in our lives to produce extraordinary results.

- 1. Can you think of times when God has provided for you?
- 2. How has God worked in the details of your life?
- 3. Can you recall times when God has had a superior solution to your plan?
- 4. When we trust God with all the details of our life, how does it affect our faith walk?
- 5. Can you cite an example of God's presence in your life? Do you see this as a personal validation of Romans 8:28?
